**David Plunk**, has been named Athletic Director and Head Football Coach and **Scott Bailey**, will be an Assistant Principal at HHS.

**Coach Plunk** has been the assistant athletic director, assistant head football coach, defensive coordinator, head power lifting coach and taught social studies at HHS, since 1998. He is a graduate of Kilgore High School, attended Kilgore College and received a B.S. E. from Stephen F. Austin State University. Coach Plunk is certified in history, kinesiology, and driver's education. He has been in Hallsville 13 years and previously held the offensive coordinator position at Cooper High School. Coach Plunk says, "I've personally experienced the effect teachers and coaches have on a young person's life. My goal is to be a positive influence in coaching and assist the teaching staff in the total education of the students in the Hallsville Independent School District." David and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Kyle age 6, John David age 4, and Jack age 2 months. Kelly teaches fourth grade at Hallsville Intermediate School. Coach Plunk enjoys playing golf.

**Scott Bailey**, HHS new Assistant Principal, has had an interest in academics since a child. He attended Hallsville schools and graduated from Hallsville High School as a National Merit Scholar and Valedictorian of the class in 1992. He was on the Dean's list at Baylor University, where he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree with a major in Science. Following graduation, he said he was determined to get back to HHS as quickly as he could. HISD hired Scott in 1996 and since that time he has taught chemistry, physical science, principles of technology, driver's education, and algebra. In addition to teaching, he served as *Odyssey of the Mind* coach for three years, assistant debate coach for two years and Student Council sponsor for seven years. Other assignments included developing the master schedule for the high school campus, participating in teacher interviews, student discipline, summer school principal, and acting administrator for campus ARD meetings, during a principal internship. "I have the desire to give back to my school and community that which HISD gave to me in a way that will prove to be a valuable contribution to the students, the school and society. I am committed to this campus, school district and community," stated Mr. Bailey. He is married to Jennifer, an English teacher at HHS.

- 7) **Be Your Best for the Children of Hallsville.**


My favorite concept is #7. **Be Your Best for the Children of Hallsville.** Our employees strive everyday to be the best for the children of Hallsville I.S.D.

# Hallsville I.S.D. Sets All-Time Attendance Record

Hallsville I.S.D. achieved the highest daily attendance this past school year in the history of the school district. Not only did the District set a record, but the Intermediate, Middle School, and Junior High set all-time attendance records on their campuses. The Primary, Elementary, and High School achieved the second highest attendance records in the history of their campuses.

Superintendent Greg Wright said he is very proud of this historical accomplishment. This is a result of high expectations, teamwork, and a very strong truancy program. This past year, we set the very high expectation of exceeding our 2004 attendance marks and trying to establish all-time school records on every campus.

Mr. Wright said he is very pleased with the attendance on all campuses. "Teamwork Makes the Dream Work" is a motto in the District that helped attendance records become a reality. Mr. Wright said the "Teamwork" was a result of outstanding leadership from campus administrators, attendance office personnel, teachers, nurses, bus drivers, cafeteria workers, and others in the district. He complimented the parents of Hallsville I.S.D. for making it a priority that their children attend school everyday. He also complimented the District's Truancy Officer, Zell Stevens, and Judge Mike Smith for enforcing a strong District Truancy Program. "We tripled our truancy cases from 136 in the 2004 school year to 325 this past school year. We are sending a message to parents that poor attendance is not acceptable at Hallsville I.S.D."

Research has proven that good attendance is correlated to better student academic performance. Wright also said that nothing replaces the great classroom instruction a student gets from teachers when they are in school everyday. Mr. Wright stated that he was very proud of the entire district this past winter for overcoming one of the worst flu outbreaks in recent years. During the fourth six weeks, not one single record was set because of high absences due to the flu. Campus leadership worked hard to finish the year strong with good attendance during the fifth and sixth six weeks attendance periods. Every campus and the District set all-time school records in the history of the school during the sixth six weeks. Wright was excited to think what the records could have been without the flu outbreak and the poor fourth six weeks attendance. Wright concluded by saying, "I am very proud of all the students of Hallsville I.S.D. for making a commitment to be in school everyday. It shows their priorities support education."

TEAMWORK MAKES THE DREAM WORK

**Hallsville ISD IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS**  
**Texas State Health Department**

Proof of the following completed and up-to-date immunizations, as required in Texas schools, is necessary for school enrollment and continued attendance:

**Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis**

- v Upon entry into Kindergarten, students are required to have five doses, unless the fourth dose was received on or after the fourth birthday, in which case only four doses are required.
- v Four doses of vaccine required (Pre-school; less than 5 years)
- v Students who started their vaccinations after age seven are required to have at least three doses of a tetanus-diphtheria containing vaccine.
- v Four doses of vaccine with the last dose being since age 4 and within the last 10 years required for grades 6-12

**Polio**

- v Every student entering kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade must have proof of four doses, one of which must have been received on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday.
- v Students entering preschool and less than 5 years old must have proof of 3 doses.

**Measles/Mumps/Rubella**

- v Every student entering Kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade must enter with 2 doses, with one dose on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday.
- v Only serologic confirmation (laboratory report) of immunity in lieu of the vaccine is acceptable.
- v Every student 3 or 4 years of age must enter with one dose given on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday

**Haemophilus Influenzae Type b (Hib)**

- v One dose for ages 15 months to 4 years, unless a schedule for a primary series and booster was met by 15 months of age.
- v Physician-validated date of invasive Hib disease after 2<sup>nd</sup> birthday will substitute for vaccine requirement.

**Hepatitis B**

- v Three doses for kindergarten through 11<sup>th</sup> grade for 2005-06 and kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> for 2006-05
- v **Or** serologic confirmation (laboratory report) of Hepatitis B immunity.
- v If the first dose is given after the 13<sup>th</sup> birthday, two doses are required.

**Varicella (chickenpox)**

- v One dose on or after the first birthday for **2005-06** for kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade and 7<sup>th</sup> through 11<sup>th</sup> grade
- v 2006-07 and thereafter is kindergarten through 12<sup>th</sup> grade
- v **Or:** written validation from the parent or physician giving the approximate date of the varicella illness
- v Serologic confirmation of varicella immunity.
- v Two doses are required if the child was thirteen years old or older at the time of the first dose.

Please review the above requirements with your doctor or health clinic to be up to date with the Texas State Health Department of Immunization Requirements for students (TAC 97.61-97.77). All immunizations should be completed by the first day of school attendance. The law requires that students be fully vaccinated against the specified disease. **Please bring all immunization records to your school nurse.**

Hot Lunches Served Children who qualify under US Department of Agriculture guidelines may get meals free or at a reduced-price of \$.40 for lunch and \$.30 for breakfast. Children need healthy meals to learn. The Hallsville ISD offers healthy meals every school day. Your children may qualify for reduced-price meals.

**Free and Reduced Lunches**

Free and reduced meals are available in HISD's cafeterias to students in families that meet income eligibility standards. The reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and \$.40 for lunch. Hallsville Independent School District receives funding from the federal government based on the number of students eligible to receive free/reduced lunches. It is important that all students complete the form in order to determine eligibility.

**Forms are available** in each principal's office and will be available at registration, Meet the Teacher night, from the food service office, or school administration building. Depending on your income, your children may be eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Your children may qualify to get free school meals if you get food stamps or Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF).
