11 Warning Signs that a Student in your Class May Have Dyslexia

Does the Student:

- 1. Have difficulty learning the letter names and sounds?
- 2. Have trouble knowing that sounds can be represented by letters or groups of letters?
- 3. Struggle to hear and manipulate sounds in words, such as removing sounds in words?
- 4. Read slowly and inaccurately?
- 5. Repeatedly misspell and misread frequently used words?
- 6. Have trouble remembering how to spell words over time?
- 7. Read a word correctly on one line and then fail to recognize it later in the text?
- 8. Have problems sustaining attention to literacy activities and dislike or a reluctance to read?
- 9. Not progress at the expected rate even with extra help being provided?
- 10. Have average to above average abilities in other areas?
- 11. Have a family member that has dyslexia or difficulties with reading and writing?

Dyslexia: What is it NOT?

- It's not seeing letters or words backwards.
- It's not seeing letters jump around on the page.
- It's not a visual processing problem that's corrected with a colored overlay
