Student Academic Achievement Strengths

Over the past several years we have seen an increase our student performance in all subgroups. In 2018, we saw that students that came from economically

disadvantaged homes were performing at the same level as our all student percentage. Increasing our low socio student data was a goal for the campus in 2018-2018 school year. Last year North Elementary earned a 100% on the state category, "Closing the Achievement Gap". Due to this score North Elementary was tied for first in the state's comparison group for our campus earning us a distinction in this area. This speak volumes to the instructional practices, goal setting, and reaching all students. North Elementary does not focus all resources on one sub group or one specific performing group area. North Elementary truly focuses on all students no matter their economic status, their ethnicity, or their performance area. Each child is targeted for their needs so that they all can grow and be successful.

The state of Texas now has three categories for each test a student can fall in, approaching, meets, and masters. The percentage for these areas are not consistent between subject or grade levels. The highest rating is masters and lowest is approaching. In 2018 we had for the first time in five years both subject areas above 90% for the state minimum "passing" rate. In 2016, when the state started the three categories, North was at 53% meets in math and 51% meets in reading. In 2018 North Math was at 61% meets and Reading was 60% meets. In 2016 in Math North had 25% at mastery level and 19% in Reading. In 2018 in Math North had 31% at mastery level and 35% in Reading. This is evidence that our students are being challenged and we as a campus are continuing to grow in problem solving, higher level thinking, and reading comprehension.
