2020 Scholarship Timetable for High School Seniors

Now is the time to begin searching for scholarships for which you may be eligible – they are out there, but you need to look for them. This guide is a good place to start. And remember – your high school guidance counselor is a valuable resource. Visit with them frequently and check bulletins and listings available at your school. Also check with the financial aid offices of schools to which you are applying. Knowing what sources of aid are available to you may help you determine your school of choice.

There are a few important deadlines to make note of concerning ETCF Scholarships:

Prior to Applying

- Request unofficial copies of your transcripts. Transcripts should include Fall semester grades.
- Take the SAT and/ or ACT test if required by your college or university.
- Obtain email addresses of 2 people who are willing to submit reference letters on your behalf as part of the application process.
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.ed.gov. **FAFSA is available to complete beginning October 1st**. We recommend applying as early as possible.

December 1, 2019

Scholarship applications open to students online at **www.ETCF.org December 1, 2019.** A student may apply for every scholarship for which he or she meets the eligibility requirements. Applicants must submit an unique application for each scholarship. Do not submit only the common application.

How To Apply

- Access the list of East Texas Communities Foundation scholarships at **www.ETCF.org** (click on Scholarships, Available Scholarships).
- Click on the scholarship matching tools to determine your eligibility to apply.
- Begin search using matching questionaire.
- Once eligibility is determined, click **Save to My Applications** to be taken to the online application system.

• If it is your **first time to access** the online application, you will be asked to create a **log in and password**. Make sure you use a valid email address. You can exit and save your application to complete another day. Remember your log in information as you will need it to get back into your application. Submitted applications may be edited up to the deadline.

February 3rd or March 2nd

Applications and required supporting documents, including references, must be submitted online at **www.ETCF.org** on or before either **February 3**, **2020 or March 2**, **2020 at 5:00 p.m.**, unless noted otherwise. The deadline will be clearly noted on both the application and website.



Scholarship Scams

During your senior year of high school, you may notice the volume of mail you receive substantially increases. Offers from colleges and universities, financial agencies and companies that guarantee college scholarships for just \$39.99! Annually, scholarship scams take millions of dollars from unsuspecting students. Government attorneys investigating fraud in scholarship search services offer these six clues to identify "scholarship scams."



- They ask for money. A legitimate scholarship does not require a fee to apply.
- They offer a money back guarantee. Most guarantees have restrictions that are impossible to meet.
- They claim to have access to information that can't be found anywhere else. The same scholarships are listed in dozens of free databases, directories and catalogs, as well as online.
- They ask for a credit card or bank account number. Never give out this information. You might unknowingly sign up for automatic withdrawals that you cannot stop only the organization can stop automatic withdrawals. It might be months before you notice and contacting the organization is difficult.
- They claim they will do all the work. For most scholarships, the applicant must fill out and submit the application themselves. All they do is perform a search of free databases that you can do yourself.
- They congratulate you on winning a contest you never entered or for being selected by a national foundation. If you didn't apply for it – you didn't win it.

Now that you know what to look for, it's easy to not get taken in by scholarship scams. Just use common sense and do your own research. This scholarship directory is a great place to start!

The following pages contain a listing and discription of scholarships available to students in the 32 counties served by East Texas Communities Foundation.

A.D. and Mary Winston Scholarship

The A.D. and Mary Winston Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior from a Smith County public high school entering Texas A&M University.

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a resident of Smith County and a graduating senior at any public high school within Smith County.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a 3.0 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale in high school studies.

College or University to be Attended

The student must be admitted to attend Texas A&M University. (Blinn TEAM does not qualify.)

College Major

Recipient may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need will be considered but will not be weighted above other criteria for scholarship selection.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Adam Carroll Scholarship

Established in 2002 with gifts from the family and friends of Adam Carroll, this scholarship honors the memory of a young man known for his love of people, his zest for life and his love of sports. An honor graduate of Grand Saline High School, Adam was a gifted baseball player, a handsome guy with an infectious smile, and a young man who had big dreams for his life. One of Adam's favorite sayings was "Always remember who you are, where you come from and what you represent." Adam Carroll knew who he was, he knew where he came from, both geographically and spiritually, and he knew he represented his family, his school and his Lord. The Adam Carroll Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior of Grand Saline High School who has participated in high school athletics or cheerleading.

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a graduating senior from Grand Saline High School and a resident of Van Zandt, Wood, or Smith County.

Academic Record

Recipient must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

Other Eligibility Requirements

Recipient must have participated in high school athletics or cheerleading.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Preference will be given to students for whom college expenses will be a financial hardship.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Alex Fleming Infinity Scholarship

Born December 4, 1989, in Bedford, Texas, Alex Fleming was a junior at Whitehouse High School, where he was respected and admired by students and teachers alike for his numerous achievements. Alex was a member of the National Honor Society, a varsity football and track letterman, and played for the junior varsity baseball team. Moreover, he distinguished himself through his involvement in the Whitehouse High School Band and Jazz Band.

The purpose of the Alex Fleming Infinity Scholarship Fund is to provide a scholarship to a graduating senior at Whitehouse High School who has participated in the band program for 4 years and shows high moral character. This is a merit based scholarship, and preference will be given to students who have participated successfully in the honors academic program.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a graduating senior at Whitehouse High School.

Academic Record

Preference will be given to students who have participated successfully in the honors academic program.

Other Eligibility Requirements

Applicant must have participated in the band for 4 years

College or University to be Attended

Recipient may attend any accredited college or university in the United States

College Major

Recipient may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.



Scholarship Amount

Recently \$1,250 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Allen and Nancy Locklin Scholarship

The Allen and Nancy Locklin Scholarship is awarded to a graduating high school senior from Smith County who plans to attend the University of Texas at Tyler. The recipient must demonstrate outstanding citizenship, leadership qualities, Christian devotion, excellent moral character, and a commitment to community service.

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a graduating senior from a public, private or home school in Smith County.

Academic Record

Recipient must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Applicants must plan to enroll as a full-time student at the University of Texas at Tyler.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need will be considered but will not be weighted above other criteria for scholarship selection.

Length of Support

The scholarship is renewable for up to 4 years (a total of 5 years) if the student:

- Remains a full-time student (at least 12 hours) at the University of Texas at Tyler and
- Maintains a 3.0 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale each semester.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$2,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Art Excellence Scholarship

An anonymous donor established the Art Excellence Scholarship Fund to provide educational scholarships for primarily non-traditional students pursuing Studio Art or Art History at the University of Texas at Tyler.

Academic Record

Applicants must have achieved a GPA of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her undergraduate or graduate program.

College or University to be Attended

Applicant must be a current student at the University of Texas at Tyler.

College Major

Applicant must be at least a sophomore at the time of application and must have declared his or her major to be Studio Art or Art History as a full-time student in an undergraduate or graduate program.

Other Requirments

Preference will be given to non-traditional students in the following order: female students over age 40, male students over age 40, or single parents with no age preference. Applicants should be available for a personal interview and have the ability to present or display 1-5 projects which they consider to be their most significant achievements, if requested.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$500- \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Barbara Bass Community College Scholarship

This scholarship was established to honor Barbara Bass's years of service as mayor of the City of Tyler. The recipient must be a resident of Tyler and a first generation college student.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a resident of the City of Tyler and a graduating senior in a public, private or homeschool high school.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her high school.

College or University to be Attended

The recipient must plan to attend a community college as a full time undergraduate student, pursuing an associate's degree.

Other Requirements

Applicants must be first generation college students, meaning neither of your parents attended college.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is a secondary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one additional year if the recipient continues to meet all criteria.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Initially, \$1,250 will be awarded.

Ben & Bettye Bitz Scholarship

Ben and Bettye Bitz enjoyed their retirement years in Berryville, Texas where they were actively involved in their church and community. They generously supported youth education. He was also a WWII veteran who proudly served his country during the Normandy invasion, and she was a member of the Disabled American Veterans Auxillary. This scholarship supports students from Frankston High School in Anderson County, Texas and LaPoyner High School in Henderson County, Texas.



High School / Residency

Applicants must be graduating seniors at Frankston High School in Anderson County, Texas or LaPoyner High School in Henderson County, Texas.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a GPA of at least a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Historically, \$1,000 has been awarded.

Ben and Florine Ramsey Scholarship

Mrs. Ramsey established this scholarship in memory of her husband, Ben, who was extremely proud of his hometown of San Augustine, Texas and who believed in the importance of education.

High School / Residency

Applicants must be graduating seniors or prior graduates of San Augustine High School in San Augustine, Texas.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients must be attending or admitted to attend any accredited four-year college or university in the State of Texas as a full-time student.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration. Students meeting all other eligibility criteria but with little financial need may also apply.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$750 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Betty and Roy Erickson Scholarship

Established by Betty and Roy Erickson to enable worthy students to attend college, this scholarship is to be awarded to a graduating senior from an East Texas high school.

High School / Residency

The recipient must be a graduating senior attending a public, private or home school in an ETCF East Texas county.*

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a minimum GPA of at least a 4.0 weighted on a 4.0 scale. Also, the applicant must have exemplary test scores in either: the <u>SAT</u> composite score must be 1400 or higher (math and evidence-based reading and writing), or the <u>ACT</u> composite score must be 31 or higher (English, math, reading & science).

College or University to be Attended

The student must plan to pursue an associate's or bachelor's degree at an accredited college or university located in the State of Texas.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

Historically this scholarship is awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Brook Hill Founder's Scholarship

Steve Dement created this scholarship to enable students attending the college preparatory school he founded, The Brook Hill School, to continue their education at Baylor University where he earned three degrees. Mr. Dement continues to teach history and government at Brook Hill while also operating Landmark Title and a real estate law practice. His faith guides all these ventures as he models for his students how to honor, serve, and rely upon God in all that they do.

High School/ Residency

Applicant must a graduating senior from The Brook Hill School in Bullard, Texas.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a 3.0 GPA or higher (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school studies.

College or University to be Attended

Applicant must plan to enroll, and remain enrolled, as a full-time student at Baylor University in Waco, Texas. Applicant must have a written acceptance from Baylor University.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.



Financial Need

Financial need may be considered in the selection process but is not required.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only. In future years, the scholarship MAY be renewable.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Historically, \$2,500 has been awarded.

Carroll and Casey Gurganus Scholarship

The Carroll and Casey Gurganus Scholarship was established to benefit outstanding students with financial need at Palestine High School. Recipients should demonstrate leadership ability through participation in extracurricular activities, community service, and/ or work experience during high school.

High School / Residency

Applicants must be graduating seniors at Palestine High School, in Palestine, Texas.

Academic Record

Recipients must be ranked in the top 25% of his or her high school graduating class.

High School Activities

Recipient should demonstrate leadership ability through participation in extracurricular activities, community service, and /or work experience during high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be renewable for up to three years, if the recipient meets the following criteria:

 $\hfill \bullet$ Continues to pursue an undergraduate degree, Is a full-time student, and

• Maintains a minimum cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her undergraduate program.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Historically, \$2,500 has been awarded.

Christopher Lyon Memorial Scholarship

Established in 2007 with gifts from the family and friends of Christopher Lyon, this scholarship honors the memory of a young man known for his art, delicate soul, and quirky laugh.

Chris was born on October 24, 1973, in Greenville, S.C. An artist by profession, he received his BFA in Drawing, Painting and Photography from Western Carolina University in 1996. He completed his MFA

in Painting from the University of Pennsylvania in 1999, where he met his wife Alexis, also an UPenn graduate and now an art professor at the University of Texas at Tyler. The couple moved to Whitehouse in 2004.

Chris died on January 9th, 2007, as a result of a motor vehicle accident. This scholarship was created to remember Chris, encourage young art students, and reward them for their hard work.

High School / Residency

Preference will be given to applicants who have attended high school in Texas, Louisiana, Arkansas, or Oklahoma.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school, and, if applicable, in his or her undergraduate and graduate program.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients must currently attend or be accepted to attend the University of Texas at Tyler.

College Major

Recipient must be a full-time student who, at the time of application, has declared his or her major to be art in an undergraduate program or is enrolled in an art master's degree program at the University of Texas at Tyler.

Other Eligibility Requirements

Preference will be given to applicants who demonstrate exemplary achievement and potential in art. Applicants should be available for a pesonal interview and have the ability to present or display 1-5 projects which they consider to be their most significant schievements, if requested.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Citizens 1st Bank /Perkins Family Foundation State Employees' Children's Scholarship

This scholarship was established through the generosity of Citizens 1st Bank and the Perkins Family Foundation in appreciation for the dedication of the State of Texas employees.

High School / Residency

Applicant must a resident of Cherokee, Nacogdoches, or Smith County and a graduate or graduating senior from any public, private, or home school in one of those counties.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 2.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her studies.

Other Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must be the child of a current employee of the State of Texas. (Independent school district employees are not considered



employees of the State.)

Applicants must have demonstrated the potential to make a worthy contribution to the community and have excellent moral character.

Applicants must be under the age of 22 years old at the time of their initial application.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need will be considered but will not be weighted above other criteria for scholarship selection.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year. Students who maintain a 2.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale), remain a full-time student, and complete at least 24 college credit hours each year may reapply. The entire application process must be completed for consideration.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

David G. and Jacqueline M. Braithwaite

Scholarship in Chemistry

This scholarship was created in memory of Dr. Braithwaite by his widow, Jacqueline. Dr. Braithwaite was a research chemist and Chairman and CEO of Nalco Chemical Company. He was widely recognized in his field for his expertise and innovations. This scholarship will be awarded to an East Texas graduating senior who plans on majoring in chemistry in college.

High School / Residency

Applicant must a graduating senior from a public, private, or home school in one of ETCF's East Texas counties.*

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States as a full-time student.

College Major

Recipients must plan to major in chemistry. There is a preference for chemistry or biochemistry majors over chemical engineering majors.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship is awarded for one year, and may be renewed subject to committee approval for up to three additional years, provided the recipient:

- Maintains a 3.0 GPA
- Remains a full-time student
- Continues to pursue a major in chemistry

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$3,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

David G. and Jacqueline M. Braithwaite Scholarship for Medicine, Veterinary Medicine and Biotechnology

This scholarship is but one of the numerous generous philanthropic gifts to the Tyler community made possible by Mrs. Braithwaite. This scholarship will be awarded to an East Texas graduating senior who plans on majoring in biology, mathematics, engineering or a related field which will allow the student to pursue a career in medicine, biotechnology, or veterinary medicine. Only students planning a career as a doctor, dentist, veterinarian, or biotechnologist qualify. Please apply for other scholarships ETCF offers if you plan a career as a nurse, occupational therapist, physical therapist, physician's assistant, pharmacist, neuroscientist, dietician, etc.

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a graduating senior from a public, private or home school in one of ETCF's East Texas counties.*

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States as a full-time student.

College Major

Applicants must plan on pursuing an undergraduate major in biology, mathematics, engineering, or a related field that will allow them to pursue a career in medicine, biotechnology, or veterinary medicine.

Financial Need

Financial need will NOT be considered.

Length of Support

This scholarship is awarded for one year, and may be renewed subject to committee approval for up to three additional years, provided the recipient:

- Maintains a 3.0 GPA
- Remains a full-time student
- Continues to pursue a major that will lead to a career as a doctor, dentist, veterinarian, or biotechnologist

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$3,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.



David G. and Jacqueline M. Braithwaite Scholarship in Vocational/Technical Study in Medically-Related Fields

This scholarship is but one of the numerous generous philanthropic gifts to the Tyler community made possible by Mrs. Braithwaite. This scholarship will be awarded to an East Texas individual, regardless of age, pursuing full time study for vocational/technical certificates and/or associate degrees in medically-related fields such as: radiology, sonography, surgical technology, physical therapy assistant, occupational therapy assistant, respiratory care, EMT, wellness, etc.

Because this scholarship is intended to aid persons who wish to receive medically-related vocational training and get into the workforce as quickly as possible, students seeking bachelor's degrees are not eligible. Nursing students should apply for a different ETCF scholarship.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a resident of one of ETCF's East Texas counties.*

Academic Record

There is no minimum GPA requirement for this scholarship.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States as a full-time student.

College Major

Recipients must plan to pursue a vocational/technical certificate or associates degree in a medically-related field. Students seeking four year degrees are not eligible.

Financial Need

Financial need will NOT be considered.

Length of Support

This scholarship is awarded for the entire course of study, provided the recipient:

- Maintains the minimum GPA required by their course of study.
- Remains a full-time student as defined by their program.
- Continues to pursue a certificate or associates degree in a medically-related field.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Dr. Elbert H. Caldwell Scholarship

The E. H. Caldwell Scholarship Fund was established in 2001 by the family of Dr. Elbert H. Caldwell, a beloved and respected surgeon whose name became synonymous with East Texas medicine. Throughout his 46-year career in East Texas, Dr. Caldwell earned the respect and love of both his patients and medical colleagues. Motivated by principles of fairness and honesty, as well as high ethical standards, Dr. Caldwell helped found and cultivate the sophisticated level of medicine that characterizes East Texas medicine today.

Scholarships from the E. H. Caldwell Scholarship Fund are awarded to East Texas residents wishing to pursue careers in medically related fields, particularly nursing.

High School / Residency

Applicants must be high school graduates and residents of East Texas.

Academic Record

Recipients must have completed a minimum of 30 college-credit hours in a medically related program in human healthcare with a 3.0 cumulative GPA or better.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients must be pursuing a career in human healthcare with an emphasis on:

- Associate Degree Nursing (RN)
- Bachelor of Science Degree, Nursing (BSN)
- Masters of Science Degree, Nursing (MSN)
- Doctorate Degree in Nursing.

Financial Need

Financial need will NOT be considered.

Length of Support

This scholarship is awarded for one year, and may be renewed through the completion of the committee-approved degree, provided the recipient:

- Maintains a 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Enrolls in the number of hours required by the program to maintain satisfactory progress
- Remains in the current medically-related program

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$2,500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Donald Scott Cooper Nursing Foundation Scholarship

This scholarship was established by Donald Scott Cooper to encourage students from Gregg, Rusk, and Smith Counties who plan to major in nursing. Mr. Cooper has received excellent nursing care throughout his life and, in turn, hopes to repay the profession of nursing with this award.

The amount awarded may vary depending on number of scholarships and funds available.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a GPA of at least 2.8 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipient must plan to major in instrumental music education.

Other Requirements

Applicants should demonstrate high moral character and show musical aptitude and leadership through participation and success in some or all of the following areas:

- TMEA All Region, All Area, or All State
- UIL Solo and Ensemble contest, Region or State
- Section leader
- •Band leadership positions

Financial Need

Financial need will be considered but not weighted above other criteria.

Length of Support

This scholarship is awarded for up to a total of three years if the student:

- •Continues to pursue an undergraduate degree in
 - instrumental music education
- •Maintains a minimum cumulative 2.8 GPA (on a 4.0 scale)
- Is a full-time student

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Initially, \$400 will be awarded.

Tim King Memorial Scholarship

Tim King was a graduate of Robert E. Lee High School and the University of Texas at Austin. He began working for Brookshire Grocery Company (BGC) at the age of 16 until he completed his BBA from the University of Texas. Upon graduation, Tim first worked for an accounting firm and later joined BGC as a financial accountant. At the time of his death, Tim was Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer. He served on the board of directors for BGC and was active in Texas Society of CPAs, Texas Retailers Association, Big Brothers-Big Sisters, Salvation Army, Children's Advocacy Center, and Tyler Economic Development Council. He was truly a servant leader who was loved by all who had the unique opportunity to work with him. Family and friends have established this scholarship fund in honor of Tim King so that Robert E. Lee High School graduates may be able to attend the University of Texas.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a graduating senior at Robert E. Lee High School in Tyler, Texas.

Academic Record

Applicant must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipient must be accepted to attend the University of Texas in Austin and plan to enroll as a full time student.

College Major

Recipient may pursue an undergraduate degree in any major. All Robert E. Lee seniors planning to attend UT Austin are encouraged to apply. Since Tim King earned a degree in business, preference may be given to business and accounting majors.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$3,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Texas Rose Festival Scholarship

This scholarship will be awarded to a Smith County graduating senior or a current college student. Preference is for those who have participated in the Boys and Girls Clubs of East Texas.

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a graduating senior at a Smith County public, private, or home school or a current college student who attended a Smith County school.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her studies.



College or University to be Attended

Recipients must attend a college or university located in the State of Texas.

College Major

Recipient may major in any subject.

Preference

Preference is given to students who have participated in the Boys and Girls Clubs of East Texas.

Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

T.J. Ivey Scholarship

The Thomas James Ivey scholarship supports students from Buffalo High School in Buffalo, Texas or Leon High School in Jewett, Texas.

High School / Residency

Applicants must be graduating seniors at Buffalo High School in Buffalo, Texas or Leon High School in Jewett, Texas.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a GPA of at least a 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Historically, \$2,000 has been awarded.

Tyler Citizens Police Academy Alumni

Association Scholarship

This scholarship was established through the fundraising efforts of the Tyler Citizens Police Academy Alumni Association. This group of citizens, who have participated in the Tyler Police Department's Citizen Police Academy, know first hand the caliber of Tyler's Police Department. This scholarship will be awarded to a dependent of a Tyler Police Department employee.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a graduating high school senior or a previous graduate from any accredited public or private high school.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 2.5 (on a 4.0

scale) in his or her high school or college studies.

Other Eligibility Requirements

Recipient must be a child of a current employee of the City of Tyler, Texas Police Department.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States as a full time student.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship is awarded for one year. Recipients may reapply as long as their parent remains an employee of the City of Tyler Police Department.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Velma Lemons Future Teachers Scholarship

To honor the long-time teaching career of their mother, the children of Velma Lemons established this scholarship to assist students from Anderson, Cherokee, Gregg, Henderson, Rains, Rusk, Smith, Upshur, Van Zandt, and Wood Counties who plan to major in education.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a graduate or graduating senior of a public, private, or home school located in Anderson, Cherokee, Gregg, Henderson, Rains, Rusk, Smith, Upshur, Van Zandt, or Wood County in East Texas.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the State of Texas.

College Major

Recipients must plan to major in education.

Other Eligibility Requirements

The recipient must have demonstrated the potential to make a worthy contribution to the community, Christian devotion, and excellent moral character.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Historically, \$500 has been awarded.

Vision for Your Future Scholarship

Dr. Neshia Rudd established this scholarship in 2016 to encourage and support Smith County students interested in entering the medical profession. To reflect the donor's gender and specialty, preference is for female students planning to study optometry, ophthalmology, or other eye-care related specializations.

High School / Residency

Applicant must a graduating senior from a public, private or home school located in Smith County in East Texas.

Academic Record

Recipients must have achieved a GPA of at least 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale) in his or her high school.

Gender Preference

To encourage and support women in the medical profession, preference will be given to female students who meet the criteria for this scholarship.

College or University to be Attended

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States.

College Major

Recipients must plan on pursuing a medically-related course of study with a preference for optometry, ophthalmology, or other eye-care related specializations.

Financial Need

Financial need will NOT be considered.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Historically, \$1,000 has been awarded.

Wayne & Margie Morrison Scholarship

The Wayne and Margie Morrison Scholarship Fund was established in 2019 through the generosity of Wayne and Margie Morrison. The Morrison's believed in always paying it forward and established this scholarship to benefit Smith County graduating seniors attending a four-year college or university in East Texas.

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a graduating senior from a public or private high school or home school located in Smith County.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a GPA of at least a 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale) in his/her high school.

College or University to be Attended

Recipient may attend any accredited four-year college or university in East Texas (Texas A&M-Texarkana, LeTourneau University, East Texas Baptist University, Stephen F. Austin, University of Texas (Tyler, Palestine and Longview), Jarvis Christian College, Texas College and Wiley College.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.



Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship may be renewed for 3 years (a total of 4 years) if all renewal criteria are met:

- Continues to pursue a bachelor's degree
- Remains a full-time student (at least 12 hours)
- Maintains a 3.0 cumulative GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale.

Scholarship Amount

Varies depending on funds available and number of scholarships awarded. Initially, \$4,000 will be awarded.

Whitehouse Young Farmers Scholarship

This scholarship fund was established by an ag bootser club to help students attend college who have participated in Agricultural Education while attending Whitehouse High School.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a graduating senior from Whitehouse High School.

Academic Record

The recipient must have achieved a 2.5 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale in high school studies.

Other Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must have enrolled in an Agricultural Education class for at least one year in high school. Preference will be given to students who participated in FFA.

College or University to be Attended

Recipient may attend an accredited two-year or four-year college or university, or an accredited technical school as a full-time student.

College Major

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial Need

Financial need is a primary consideration.

Length of Support

This scholarship will be awarded for one year only.

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,500 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.



Winifred K. George Scholarship

Established by Winifred George, this scholarship is to be awarded to a Smith County graduating senior who plans to attend Abilene Christian University.

High School / Residency

Applicant must be a graduating senior from a Smith County public, private, or home school.

Academic Record

Applicant must have achieved a GPA of at least 2.75 (on a 4.0 scale).

College or University to be Attended

Recipient must plan to attend and remain at Abilene Christian University, enrolled as a full-time student.

College Major

Preference will be given to students who are planning to pursue a career in Christian ministry.

Financial Need

Financial need is not a consideration.

Length of Support

The scholarship is renewable for up to 3 years (a total of 4 years) if the student:

- remains a full-time student (12 hours) at Abilene Christian University
- maintains a 2.75 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale each semester

Scholarship Amount

Historically \$1,000 has been awarded but may vary depending on funds available and number of scholarships issued.

Winnie Frank Woolverton Scholarship

High School / Residency

Recipient must be a male student from Palestine High School in Anderson County, Texas.

Academic Record

Recipients may attend any accredited college or university in the United States as a full time student.

Recipients may major in any subject.

Financial need is a primary consideration for applicants.

Frequently Asked Questions About Scholarships & Financial Aid



Q) How do I know if I am eligible for a particular scholarship?

A) Most scholarships have eligibility criteria such as graduating from a high school in a certain county, planning to major in a specific course of study, attending a particular college or university. or participating in a designated extracurricular activity. You must meet all stated criteria to be eligible. Eligibility criteria is listed in summary form on the "User Friendly Scholarship Summary Chart" and in more detail under the "Available Scholarships" tab at http://etcf.org/scholarships/available-scholarships/.

Q) How do I apply?

A) All applications are required to be completed online. Access the application via the general scholarship matching tools found in the Available Scholarships tab.

Q) May I apply for more than one scholarship?

A) Yes. You must submit an application for each unique scholarship.

Q) Can I receive more than one scholarship?

A) Yes. Each scholarship committee is different and selects the best candidates within the pool of applicants available to them. If you are a strong candidate, it is possible you will be selected for multiple awards.

Q) Which counties are ETCF counties named under the hometown or geographic region eligibility requirement?

A) Anderson, Angelina, Bowie, Camp, Cass, Cherokee, Delta, Franklin, Freestone, Gregg, Harrison, Henderson, Hopkins, Houston, Lamar, Leon, Marion, Morris, Nacogdoches, Panola, Rains, Red River, Rusk, Sabine, San Augustine, Shelby, Smith, Titus, Trinity, Upshur, Van Zandt, Wood.

Q) Which high schools are considered Smith County schools for eligiblity requirements

A) Public and private schools located in Arp, Bullard, Chapel Hill, Lindale, Troup, Tyler, Whitehouse, and Winona are Smith County schools. Students residing in Smith County and within the Van ISD and Gladewater ISD boundaries are also eligible.

Q) May homeschool students apply?

A) Homeschool students may apply as private school students, assuming they meet all other eligibility criteria. Be aware that a reference from a teacher with direct classroom experience may be required and references from relatives are not allowed.

Q) Will any browser work with the scholarship application software at www.etcf.org?

A) Google Chrome is the recommended browser. Whichever browser you are using must be one of the two most recent versions.

Q) May I mail my transcript and other requested documents to ETCF?

A) No. The entire application should be submitted electronically. Simply scan the document, save it as a file, and attach that file to the application where requested. If you have mulitiple transcripts, please save in a single file.

Q) May I attach my resume' or brag sheet as a supporting document?

A) No. Only attach the requested documents. If you have more extracurricular activities or community service than space allows, include those activities most important to you in the space provided. You should be able to copy and paste from a Word document into the application.

Q) Will a screen shot of my ACT or SAT scores be acceptable as an attachment?

A) Yes.

Q) What is the deadline for references?

A) The deadline for references is the same for the application. Students will want to request references early in the process as applications **CANNOT** be submitted until references have been received by ETCF.

Q) What is the FAFSA and how do I complete it?

A) The Free Application for Federal Student Aid is used by colleges and universities to determine the amount and type of financial aid awarded to students annually. Complete the free application at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The amount your family is able to pay for school, the Expected Family Contribution or EFC, will be determined and reported to you. The EFC amount is required on all East Texas Communities Foundation need-based scholarship applications. Helpful resources related to filing the FAFSA can be found at https://studentaid.ed.gov/fafsa and https://www.edvisors.com/fafsa/ and http://www.educationquest.org/ and https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/.

Q) What if I don't have access to the Internet? Is there another method of filing the FAFSA?

A) While the U.S. Department of Education encourages filing the FAFSA online—due to a lower error rate and faster processing time—a paper version is available by calling (800) 433-3242. You may request up to three forms. In addition, a PDF version of the FAFSA will be available at www.FederalStudentAid.ed.gov. From there you can access the PDF, complete the form by computer or hand, and mail it to the address provided for processing.

Q) When will I know if I have been awarded a scholarship from East Texas Communitites Foundation?

A) Recipients will be notified by mail in April. Applicants not awarded a scholarship will be notified by e-mail.

Q) Will I receive the scholarship check?

A) No. College scholarship payments are mailed directly to the school's financial aid office. Your scholarship check will be made payable to the accredited, educational institution you are attending.
