- Students should be in their seats ready to learn by 7:55.
- Please send a note within <u>two</u> school days when your child has been absent. All notes need to be given to the front office.
- Please limit the number of times your child is checked out early. Every moment of the school day is important to their success.
- We will follow the laws set forth by the State of Texas regarding compulsory attendance. Should you have questions about excused/unexcused absences, contact the attendance office.

Grading Policies

<u>Skyward</u>

<u>Visitors</u>

Visitors must sign in with the front office and wear their identification sticker at all times during the visit. Stickers will be returned as you exit.

<u>Textbooks</u>

Textbooks or login codes for online textbooks will be distributed within the first month of school. Please contact us if you have any questions or concerns. We hope the online resources available will be valuable to learning and assist at home. At the end of the school year, you will be charged for any lost or damaged textbooks.

<u>Nurse</u>

- If your student requires routine medication, please visit with the nurse at registration or when the need arises. All medication must be brought to school by the parent in the original container and must be stored in the nurse's office.
- In the event your child is sick, the nurse will contact you to pick them up. All students who call home using their cell phone prior to nurse approval will receive an unexcused absence should they leave campus.

Delivering lunches to your student

- You may deliver a lunch for your student only.
- No deliveries for ANY STUDENT on state testing days. See the HISD calendar.
- There is a table set up in the foyer for you to put your child's name on the lunch and leave for pick up. You are also welcome to wait until they come to the foyer during their scheduled lunch time.
- Students will not be called to the office to pick up a lunch.
- HHS is not responsible for stolen lunch deliveries.

Hallsville ISD Dress Code Policy

Dress and Grooming (All Grade Levels)

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards provided that they comply with the following:

Grades 3-12:

a. Students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean, neat and will not be a health or safety hazard to themselves or others.

b. Students are expected to dress or groom themselves in clothes and accessories that are appropriate for school activities, including, but not limited to rubber soled shoes for physical education.

c. The district and or campus shall deem inappropriate any article of clothing, jewelry, body decoration, hair color or hairstyle extreme enough to create a distraction or disturb the normal routine of school, including gang-related items and obscene, provocative and suggestive symbols. Bandanas are not permitted to be worn at school.

d. Students may not wear jewelry in nose, brow, lip, or any piercing other than the ears. (NEW)

e. Students may not wear any inflammatory symbol, emblem, picture, word or slogan, including racial or drug-related items that may create a disruption of school.

f. Students may not wear low cut shirts, tank-tops, spaghetti straps, (shoulder straps must be at least two inches wide), racer-back or strapless clothing, clothing that exposes bare midriffs, excessively torn clothing or excessively loose clothing that results in sagging.

g. Dresses, skirts and shorts must be no shorter than 3" above the top of the knee.

h. Students must have appropriate coverage when wearing leggings, tights or spandex pants.

i. Students shall not wear any article of clothing that covers the face, including dark glasses unless prescribed by a physician and documented on file in the nurse's office.

j. The District discourages the wearing of expensive jewelry and other apparel and is not responsible for lost or stolen items.

k. Teachers, coaches or sponsors may define appropriate dress for school-sponsored trips and extracurricular activities.

I. Campus principal has the authority to make decisions regarding dress code that are not outlined in the Student Code of Conduct.

m. No blankets at school; bring a jacket.

HHS Dress Code

- Pajama tops, pajama bottoms, footed pajamas, house shoes, and blankets are not acceptable school attire.
- Jeans or pants with holes are acceptable as long as the holes are not more than 3 inches above the knee (same as the shorts rule).
 - Leggings can be worn under the pants if the holes are above the 3 inch rule.

Hallsville High School Dress Code Infraction

Dress Code policy will be copied and turned into AP office by the following day.

Option One - Student will be given an opportunity to self correct the problem at school.

Option Two - The principal will provide an alternate school appropriate item of clothing.

Option Three - The student has the opportunity to call the parent for new clothing, but will be sent back to class wearing principal-provided article until parent arrival. Student can exchange clothing between classes.

The third violation will result in the student being assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day.

Hallsville High School Personal Electronics Policy:

Personal Electronics are defined as cell phones, smart phones, MP3 Players, iPods, iPads, gaming devices, and any similar technology.

- 1. Students are allowed to have and use personal electronics during the following times:
 - A. Before the tardy bell rings for block 1.
 - B. During passing periods between classes
 - C. During lunch period in the cafeteria
 - D. After the dismissal bell
- 2. Students are NOT allowed to use or have in sight personal electronics during any academic period. Electronics may not be used in any location (e.g., library, hallways, gymnasium) during this time. Devices must be turned off and kept out of sight in a bag, pocket, or assigned area in the classroom.
- 3. Individual teachers may direct students to use personal electronic devices as part of a supervised learning activity. They must be used in accordance with our Internet Access Policy; if a student violates that policy, appropriate consequences will be assigned.
- 4. The use of any personal electronic device is prohibited at all times in locker rooms and restrooms.Violation will be treated as a 2nd offense cell phone infraction.

Hallsville High School Cell Phone Infractions:

First Offense: The teacher will confiscate any device used or heard during an academic period. The device will be returned to the student at the end of class. If the student refuses to turn the device over to the staff member, the student will be sent to the office and the incident will be treated as a third offense.

Second Offense: The second time in a semester that a device is used or heard, the teacher will confiscate it and turn it into the office by the end of the day. Students are allowed to pay a fee of \$15 and pick up the device at the end of the school day. If the student refuses to turn the device over to the staff member, he/she will be sent to the office and the incident will be treated as a third offense.

Third Offense: The third time a personal device is turned into the office the student's parents/guardians will be called to pick it up at the end of the school day and a \$15 fee will be assigned. The student will be registered on the No Cell Phone/Personal Electronics list, which means he or she will not be allowed to have or use any personal electronic devices at Hallsville High School for the rest of the semester. If any student on the No Cell Phone/Personal Electronics list is found in possession of such a device at Hallsville High School, the student will receive in-school or out of school suspension.

PARENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP PROCEDURES

- Drop off time is from 7:00-7:50. Students are not allowed in the building prior to 7:00.
- At 7:55, students not in their seat are considered tardy.
- Pick up time is 3:36.

PROCEDURES FOR PURCHASING A STUDENT PARKING PASS

- See Mr. Hood at the "guard shack" as you enter the student parking lot.
- The student must bring a driver's license AND a valid insurance card covering the student.
- The student will need to pay a \$5 fee for the parking permit.
- There will be a form that requires a parent signature.
- All students must park in the student parking lot located next to the coliseum.

Class Dues

<u>Non-refundable class dues are paid by each student throughout high school</u> according to the fee schedule below (fees are separate from parking and I.D. fees).

Fee Schedule:

- 9th Grade (Class of 2023) \$10 each year of high school
- 10th Grade (**Class of 2022**) \$55 if not paid by the last day of your student's 9th grade year.
- 11th Grade (Class of 2021) \$60 due by the last day of your student's 11th grade <u>fall</u> semester.
- 11th Grade (Class of 2021) spring semester dues \$65
- 12th Grade (Class of 2020) \$65 prom attendees

Prom Tickets: \$65

- Students will pay the full cost of a prom ticket if they have not paid their one time class dues prior to the deadline above.
- All underclassmen (9th and 10th graders) or approved out of district prom dates will pay for a prom ticket regardless if they have paid their class dues.

HHS Exemption Policy- Semester Exams

HHS Exam Exemption Policy – To be eligible each semester, students must meet specific criteria concerning their grade average and the number of absences/tardies in each class. The 90% attendance requirement is based on attendance per course. The teacher shall be responsible for granting the exemption. The following absences will not be counted against a student regarding their exemption: Extra-curricular school related absences, death/funeral in the immediate family (parent or sibling only), religious holidays, sent home by school nurse, College Day and 3 or fewer days in ISS.

A student will not be eligible for exemption if:

- Student has schedule changes (including those initiated by a parent/student) after the 5th day of class.
- Student who is disciplined for fighting and/or has any days of suspension.
- Student who has 2 or more office referrals for discipline during the semester.
- Student who has been assigned/served days in DAEP during current school year.
- Student is absent on the day of the exam without prior approval from the Principal.

<u>Class Grade</u>	A/B Classes	<u>4th Period</u>
"A" average (90-100)	No more than 3 absences	No more than 6 absences
"B" average (80-89)	No more than 2 absences	No more than 4 absences
"C" average (73-79)	No more than 1 absence	No more than 2 absences

***Three (3) tardies equal one (1) absence per course/class.

One absence can be waived if student has NO TARDIES for the semester.
